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

- Registered in Zurich, our team members are based in Belgium, Brazil, Canada, France, India, Kenya, UK, USA and Vietnam.







The need to end the 'book famine'

- Making special versions of books is expensive
- Only 5% of books available in accessible formats in best performing countries
- Meanwhile an accessible version of a book may be made several times over
- Barriers for accessible titles crossing borders
- Insufficient copyright provisions in many countries

- Nearly 9,000 accessible educational titles have been produced in national languages
- More than 26 training sessions in accessible book production techniques provided to NGOs, departments of education and commercial publishers



- The Book Exchange Service offers a permissions clearance system for cross border exchange of accessible titles.
- 60 libraries participate in the service
- 510,000 titles total
- 393,600 titles available for crossborder exchange without the need to request permission from the copyright owner
- In 76 languages
- 19,800 titles downloaded (July 2019)

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


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


