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International Convention for the Protection of Performers, Producers of Phonograms and Broadcasting Organizations Done at Rome on October 26, 1961

Article 3 Definitions: (a) Performers;

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For the purposes of this Convention: (a) "performers" means actors, singers, musicians, dancers, and other persons who act, sing, deliver, declaim, play in, or otherwise perform literary or artistic works;

WIPO Performances and Phonograms Treaty (WPPT) (adopted in Geneva on December 20, 1996)

Article 2 Definitions

For the purposes of this Treaty:

(a) "performers" are actors, singers, musicians, dancers, and other persons who act, sing, deliver, declaim, play in, interpret, or otherwise perform literary or artistic works or expressions of folklore;

Article 3 Beneficiaries of Protection under this Treaty⁴

(1) Contracting Parties shall accord the protection provided under this Treaty to the performers and producers of **phonograms** who are nationals of other Contracting Parties.



WIPO Performances and Phonograms Treaty (WPPT) (adopted in Geneva on December 20, 1996)

Article 15 Right to Remuneration for Broadcasting and Communication to the Public

(1) Performers and producers of **phonograms** shall enjoy the right to a single equitable remuneration for the direct or indirect use of phonograms published for commercial purposes for broadcasting or for any communication to the public.

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Berne Convention for the Protection of Literary and Artistic Works of September 9, 1886,

Article 4

Criteria of Eligibility for Protection of Cinematographic Works, Works of Architecture and Certain Artistic Works

The protection of this Convention shall apply, even if the conditions of <u>Article 3</u> are not fulfilled, to:

(a) authors of cinematographic works the maker of which has his headquarters or habitual residence in one of the countries of the Union;

Article 7 Term of Protection: 2. For cinematographic works;

(1) The term of protection granted by this Convention shall be the life of the author and fifty years after his death.





What were the consequences?

 Less rights – No moral, communication to the public or broadcast rights

Poor Contracts – Producers use all rights contracts

 Less Money – due to poor contracts and lack of remuneration right

Shorter Protection (Europe) – Audio 70 years
Audio Visual 50 years









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Beijing Treaty on Audiovisual Performances Beijing, on June 24, 2012

<u>Article 5</u> :	Moral Rights
<u>Article 6</u> :	Economic Rights of Performers in their Unfixed Performances
<u>Article 7</u> :	Right of Reproduction
<u>Article 8</u> :	Right of Distribution
<u>Article 9</u> :	Right of Rental
<u>Article 10</u> :	Right of Making Available of Fixed Performances
<u>Article 11</u> :	Right of Broadcasting and Communication to the Public



Beijing Treaty on Audiovisual Performances Beijing, on June 24, 2012

Article 12 Transfer of Rights

(1) A Contracting Party <u>may provide</u> in its national law that once a performer has consented to fixation of his or her performance in an audiovisual fixation, the exclusive rights of authorization provided for in Articles 7 to 11 of this Treaty shall be owned or exercised by or transferred to the producer of such audiovisual fixation subject to any contract to the contrary between the performer and the producer of the audiovisual fixation as determined by the national law.

(2) A Contracting Party <u>may require</u> with respect to audiovisual fixations produced under its national law that such consent or contract be in writing and signed by both parties to the contract or by their duly authorized representatives.

(3) Independent of the transfer of exclusive rights described above, national laws or individual, collective or other agreements <u>may provide</u> the performer with the right to receive royalties or equitable remuneration for any use of the performance, as provided for under this Treaty including as regards Articles 10 and 11.
